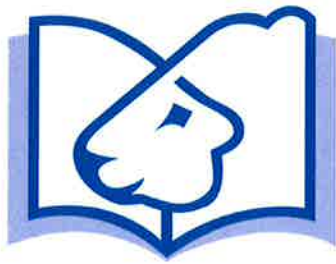

Sun. 1 *“Let perseverance finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything,”* James 1:4 NIV. Pray for steadfastness in our service, knowing that “perseverance pays off”!!

Mon. 2 Praise the Lord for the lovely tribute given to EPI’s Alma Turnbull at her Memorial Service at Markham Bible Chapel on Feb. 1. Alma was noted for her humble servant heart and her untiring work for her Savior. A great lady!

Tues. 3 Please continue to pray for a good, steady recovery for Sara Townsend whose surgery was Feb. 5. Thank the Lord that it was done laparoscopically (PED (*Pray Every Day*) Jan. 7). She has a follow-up appointment with the surgeon today. Pray for wisdom in pacing herself in returning to “normal life”.

Wed. 4 From Harold MacDougall: *“Praise the Lord for a new color printer (a Canon c750) installed on January 27. The color Canon means all of our printers are serviced by the same company.”*

Thurs. 5 Pray that all those who were at the EPI Semi-Annual Meeting in February would enjoy the Lord’s enabling as they follow up on all their responsibilities. Pray for wisdom and for servant hearts.

Sat. 14 From Mark Beach: *“Pray for the necessary permission to be given for EPI to place two 20-foot shipping containers behind the warehouse for storage as well as container projects.”*

Sun. 15 Praise the Lord for the French translation work of Alain and Christine Monclair in France. **Le Roi David (King David)** is completed and ready for circulation!

Mon. 16 Praise the Lord for the work of **New Life Prison Ministries**. In the first 8 months of the fiscal year EPI has shipped out 8,219 books for use with prisoners. Pray for eternal results in eternal lives.

Tues. 17 Pray for Brian as he continues working on the **School Ministries** project. The first 30 lessons are written and being prepared for printing. The Teacher Guides are being finished, and then he will begin writing the next 30 lessons.

March 2020

Wed. 18 From Mark: “*May we all abide continually in the truth of Gal. 2:20 — ‘I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave Himself for me.’*”

Thurs. 19 Praise the Lord for the great way our Father supplies financially at EPI, relieving the need to seek out funds!

Fri. 20 Pray for opportunities to share the love of Christ with visiting technicians and others who come to our office.

Sat. 21 Continue to pray for the successful completion and shipping of large orders for Nigeria, Kenya, and Zimbabwe (PED Nov. 26).

At time of writing there was a huge answer to prayer via an email from the supplier with helpful suggestions. Pray for resolution of this longstanding problem (PED Nov. 12).

Tues. 24 Pray that missionaries in Zambia who have contact with Portuguese and Swahili-speaking people may order our books in those languages to go in the upcoming ACCTS containers.

Wed. 25 Pray for the Lord’s direction and provision for a larger office, print shop, and warehouse facility for EPI.

Thurs. 26 Pray for the Lord’s leading and guiding in bringing Peter Kerr’s new book, ***Predestination and Election***, to completion. His will be done!

Fri. 27 Thank the Lord for some new contacts who are potential users of our Portuguese materials. Pray that they may respond positively, resulting in greater distribution of our Portuguese materials and for multiplied blessing to Portuguese-speaking believers and not-yet-believers in many places (PED Dec. 5).

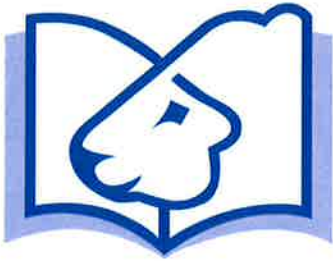
